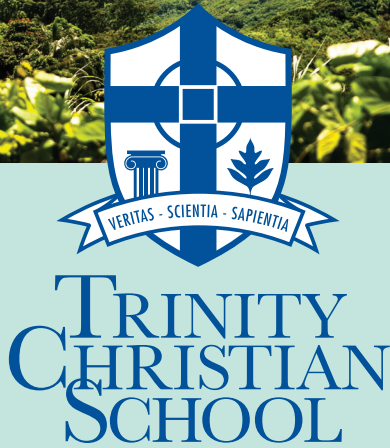




SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Students entering Kindergarten to 12th grade in Fall 2019 are eligible to apply for Summer Advantage.

REGISTRATION

Trinity students who are returning to TCS in the fall are given priority registration until March 31. April 1, registration will open to the general public on a first-come, first-served basis.

All classes are held on our Mauka Campus, located at 875 Auloa Road. Summer School workshops and Summer Fun have a maximum enrollment. Early registration is highly recommended since most classes reach maximum enrollment. REGISTRATION AND TUITION DEADLINES

March 1, 2019—Registration opens for returning and incoming TCS students. A \$100 non-refundable, non-transferable deposit will be deducted via FACTS within one week of receipt of application. This will reserve a spot for your student. The deposit will be credited towards the total tuition.

April 1, 2019—Registration opens to the general public. \$100 non-refundable, non-transferable cash or check deposit is due at time of registration. The deposit will be credited towards the total tuition.

May 1, 2019—First half of tuition due. Trinity families will have tuition deducted via FACTS. For non-TCS families, 50% of payment must be received in the Mauka Campus office. If payment is not received, your student's space may be relinquished to the next student on the waitlist.

May 15, 2019—Last day for refunds on tuition.

May 15 to Memorial Day 2019—Late Registration (if space is available) will be assessed a Late Fee of \$50. Tuition for TCS families will be made in full through FACTS on June 1. For non-TCS families, full tuition must be paid with registration. No late registrations will be accepted after Memorial Day.

June 1, 2019—Balance of tuition due. Trinity families will have tuition deducted via FACTS. For non-TCS families, final balance of tuition must be received in the Mauka Campus office. If tuition is not paid in full, your student will be prevented from attending class until payment is received.

CONFIRMATION OF REGISTRATION

A confirmation of registration email will be sent to the email address on record. If no email address is provided, registration cannot be confirmed. Confirmation will not be mailed to the home address. If we are unable to register a student in the requested class due to class size limitation, the student will be



enrolled in the other grade level course, if offered, and you will be notified of the change by email.

WITHDRAWAL / REFUNDS / CHANGES

The deposit is non-refundable and non-transferable. No tuition refunds will be given after May 15, 2019. Notification of withdrawal or program changes needs to be submitted with the **Summer Program Change Form** only. Please use the form on our website at: www.TCSKailua.net> Academics> Summer Programs. One program change will be accepted at no cost; subsequent changes will result in a \$50 change fee. Requests for changes will not be accepted over the phone or email.

CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

Trinity Christian School reserves the right to cancel any class if there is insufficient enrollment. In the event of a class cancellation by the school, the student will be enrolled in the other grade level course, if offered and you will be notified of the class change. If this class is not acceptable to you, notify the school immediately and the deposit and tuition will be refunded.

WORKSHOP A 8:00-9:50AM

Wong Way Driving

This course fulfills the six-weeks, 30-hour classroom requirement of Hawaii's law, Act 175. The official State of Hawaii Driver Education curriculum is taught by a certified instructor. A Hawaii Learner's Permit is NOT required to take this course, but a permit must be acquired at the time the Hawaii Department of Transportation Teen Classroom Certificate is issued, which will be at the end of this 3 week time frame if the student satisfactorily completes all requirements (approximately three weeks after the end of this course). The student's full name, birthdate, and permit number must be recorded and submitted to the Hawaii DOT at the time of issuance of the certificate. Also, any absences must be made up at the alternate school site. Behind-the-wheel training may be arranged for the required six hours with the instructor or other certified instructor at additional cost.

SESSION 2 | JUNE 24 – JULY 12 (NO CLASS 7/4)

WORKSHOP A 8:00-9:50 AM

SAT Preparation

Will you be taking the PSAT or SAT soon? Do you want to increase your confidence and get the best score you can? This class is for you! We will look at test strategies, sample questions, and tips to build familiarity and confidence. We will build our vocabulary and play games. We will work on sharpening our problem solving and math skills. We will read tiny articles about things like prairie chickens and the pony express. And, we will practice sample tests and work through them together.

Excellence in Writing Crash Course (Grades 5-8 only)

Do you love writing? This course is for you! Do you hate writing? This course is for you (but, be advised, you'll love it by the end)! We will explore the written word, by tackling ways to create meaning with words, build on that meaning with strategies to 'dress up' your sentences, and string together connected and logical narratives, essays, and arguments. By the end of the course, students will improve their ability to write more extensive pieces that display a



depth of understanding of written communication—and they will learn to play with language. What a great way to prepare for the new school year!

WORKSHOP B 10:10-12:00 PM

Latin for Secondary (7th and 8th grade only)

Prepare your student for Latin classes at Trinity! This class is designed both for beginning and advanced Latin students. By the end of three weeks, students with no previous Latin experience will be able to identify the basics of Latin grammar and syntax and to translate short Latin stories. Students who have studied Latin before will gain a deeper comprehension of the concepts and a greater confidence with translation. The summer class allows students to develop their knowledge of Latin through a high level of individual teacher attention and fun games that prepare them for the upcoming year.

Note: This class is **required** for incoming 7th and 8th graders.

Introduction to Computer Programming (Grades 4-7)

Hello world! This three week class is an introduction to computer programming. This course will start out with the BASIC programming language, which is a computer language originally designed to teach people how to program. Students will learn the fundamental skills of coding in a way that is easy to learn. We will draw pictures and play games. We will make mistakes and learn to fix them. Then as we progress, we will learn a little bit of Python—a powerful modern programming language that is a great way to enter into the world of modern programming.
