

Plan for Re-Opening

We are working towards a "soft" opening during the summer so that we are prepared to welcome the rest of the `ohana in August.



Campus Learning

Trinity is preparing for on-campus learning this August. We will follow specific health precautions in accordance with our local requirements. Specific decisions and plans in regards to campus modifications will be finalized over the next two months.



Drop-off and pick-up times will *likely* remain the same, although staggered times *may* be considered



Athletics will be determined by our athletic leagues and we will abide by their recommendations and requirements



After school will likely be offered for Preschool—6th grade, although after school electives will not

Preparing for Interruptions

Following trends from past pandemics, Trinity is preparing for waves of interruption to on-campus learning. In the event our local community experiences a spike in COVID-19 cases and an interruption of physical operations occurs, a shift to home learning may happen immediately.




If the physical campus closes and Trinity transitions to home learning, families will be extended credit towards fees coinciding with being on campus (lunch, before and after school).


Home Learning

Physical Campus

While specific decisions will be finalized during June and July and our "soft opening" of summer school, strategies are being developed in conjunction with health care professionals, HAIS, DHS (Department of Human Services) and the DOH in the following areas including but not limited to:



Health screening and testing for students, faculty, staff and outside vendors



Room/space capacity limits to allow for physical distancing



Modification of programs and events in compliance with limits on crowd size and physical distancing measures



Continued development of online platforms and curricula in the event of moving to home learning or a hybrid approach to keep students and faculty safe



The potential use of masks during classes and in public gathering spaces



Sanitizing and cleaning processes



Changes to campus access for visitor and parents
